WTCC : The Way Forward

Watford Town Centre is going to change recognisably over the next couple of years.



- It's rebuilding itself and reinventing itself as a major UK business hub •
 - A centre for finance and business
 - A centre for shopping
 - A centre for leisure
 - A centre for culture

How is the Church in Watford going to rise to meet the challenge of town centre ministry and mission? Just as the secular world is investing in the centre of Watford, the Church (ie not solely WTCC) needs to invest in town centre ministry.

The Trustees have a clear vision of collaboration with other agencies, not in competition or working in isolation but a vision to be part of a co-ordinated team seeking to build God's Kingdom in the heart of Watford

Like the town centre God is rebuilding the Chaplaincy. In the next two years the Trustees are hoping to establish

- A street presence, clearly visible to all shoppers and workers.
- An early evening presence for those heading into town for the cinema/restaurants etc.
- Street Angels out every night of the week.

The Trustees have been increasingly convinced that the work of the chaplaincy is one that should be rooted in the local church, of being partnered with churches in the town and working as part of a team that ministers to the town centre.

The vision includes the appointment of someone to head up this work who will:

- Facilitate volunteers
- Recruit volunteers
- Be a visible presence on the High Street alongside the volunteers.

The Trustees have a clear vision and the strategy is unfolding. They see the WTCC of the future as being a resource for all the churches in Watford to use, working alongside New Hope, the YMCA, the Food Bank etc to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ in both actions and words. This may include:

- Helping to equip individuals from different churches for ministry
- Providing a safe frame work to 'do' mission (eg Street Angels)
- Being powerful in unity
- Active listening

As trustees we are starting to have conversations with key figures in the redevelopment to hear about ways in which WTCC can be of support.

It was a great joy early in the New Year to be contacted by the police. Chief Inspector Sandwell and Inspector Lillitou praised the work of our Street Angels and recognised the sterling work that they do on the High Street on a Saturday night

Our finances are in order but are low. The current income is from two main sources: members of the Friends scheme and donations from churches. As the work of the chaplaincy is now well over ten years old it has become almost impossible to get access to grants - many organisations are willing to fund start up projects but not to maintain them. So if we do decide to go ahead and seek someone to head up the work we strongly believe God is calling us to do, we face the challenge on how to finance this kingdom work. We have been and continue to be thankful to the churches and individuals who have given so generously in the last twelve months - you have all been amazing! Thank you!

This is a really exciting time for every one of us as God challenges us to build his kingdom here in the heart of Watford where our friends, children, neighbours, congregations work, shop and spend their leisure time. Will you be part of this ministry?

Giving financially is only one of the ways that you can be involved. We need people to get involved not just as volunteer chaplains and Street Angels.
