Well, it was a bit of a nerve-racking experience, hoping and praying that our Memorial would be made whole again in time for the special Centenary Service on Sunday 11th November, but what a joy it was to see it fully restored – and on time too. Our grateful thanks to the builders for doing such a fine job.

Now all we have to do is pay for it! We haven't yet received their final invoice, but it is anticipated that it will be between £11,500 and £12,000. We have collected £5,000 from our Insurers and Watford Council have very generously donated £2,000, for which we thank them very much. Assuming the bill is £11,500, we have to find a further £4,500 so, as I said in my last article about the War Memorial, it has been suggested that members of the congregation might like to make a contribution. Perhaps it could be in memory of someone they knew - or knew of - who gave their lives in the Great War or any of the many others that

KWA MKONO NEWS

October 2018

The visit to Kwa Mkono again left mixed feelings. There were good and not so good things happening.



The children were all well and happy and there were also new children who appear to have fitted in well.

A high number of the children are doing well at school. The 2 dormitories are finished and in use and the new laundry room is complete and will be cleaned up ready for use and the incinerator was just waiting for its metal door to be made. Finally the 7 new wheelchairs are now in use and we also managed to refurbish older wheelchairs for two smaller children who had been admitted to the Centre. These are all the projects which were planned for 2018 so we are all happy. Donations given to be taken to Tanzania were used as instructed, the children were given a gift of 2 swings and 2 vegetarian meals were enjoyed by children and staff plus beans and rice brought for the store.

The vegetables and fruit are growing well at the Centre and there are crops growing at the farm and the water bowser is working well for getting water from the borehole. The Land Rover was still at the garage and the news was not good as it requires a new engine which is not available in Tanzania: it is English built, therefore very expensive. At a meeting with the Archbishop of Tanzania it was agreed that the best way forward, because the Land Rover is 13 years old and the costs high, was to sell the Land Rover, start fund raising here and the Archbishop would try and get funds from his contacts. The vehicle made for the African market and therefore ideal for the roads is a Toyota Land Cruiser.

We are trying to increase fund raising as a vehicle is required

to fetch food from the nearest town, 2 hours, prosthetic checks in Tanga, 3 hours and more. www.kwamkono.org.uk

WORLD DAY OF PRAYER (WDP) 2019



World Day of Prayer (formerly Women's World Day of Prayer - WWDP) is a Christian, women-led, ecumenical, world-wide organisation which has been around for over a century and began in the United Kingdom in 1928.

On the first Friday in March each year, a church service takes place which has been written by women of any member country in the world. The service is delivered by women but <u>all</u> are invited to attend, especially men and children. The same service is performed around the world in most countries, starting with Eastern Samoa round to Western Samoa in the Pacific. Over 24 hours of worldwide worship.

The theme for each service is chosen by the women of the country chosen to write the service that year. Many countries have participated over the years: The Philippines, Malaysia, Suriname (at Christ Church in 2018), Brazil, India, Jordan to name just a few. The United Kingdom (if it still is!) will be writing the service for 2022. Collections from the service are used to provide grants to a number of Christian charities here and abroad. In 2017, over 40 charities received a grant from WDP, including: Bible Reading Fellowship (£2000); CAFOD (£5000); MAF (UK) (£3000); Mission to Deep Sea Fishermen (£2000); The Leprosy Mission (£4000); Christian Aid in Bangladesh (£7000); and Embrace the Middle East (£6000) to name a few you may recognise.

To enable all this to happen, each country has a WDP National Committee. In England, this is based in Tunbridge Wells. The WDP National Committee feeds out to a network of local committees and there is a Watford WDP Committee. The late Audrey Komiliades was an enthusiastic member of this Committee and when she could no longer get to meetings, she asked me to take her place. I have been involved with WDP for over 10 years and I love it!

The Watford WDP Committee is made up of representatives from many churches in Watford: St Mary's, St Luke's, St Andrew's, St Peter's, Christ Church & St Mark's, All Saints, Leavesden, The Scroll Church (formerly North Watford Methodist and St Thomas' United Reformed Churches), Beechen Grove Baptist, Holy Rood and St Michael's RC Churches. Other churches in Watford have been invited to attend but have not yet sent representatives. The purpose of the local Committees is to deliver the service written by the women of that year's chosen country.

The Watford WDP Committee meets monthly for about an hour from October to March (except December) each year, usually on a Friday afternoon at whichever church is hosting the service that year – it was Christ Church in 2018. That was the first time we had hosted it in 10 years! There is a Preparation Day in November, usually at St Luke's in place of a monthly meeting. A member of the National Committee attends to:

- tell us something about the country that has written the service it improves my geography no end!
- lead a Bible study on the passage chosen for the service;
- run through the service and hymns; and
- bring news from other countries, committees and the National Committee.

The Preparation Day is open to representatives from all local committees in this part of Hertfordshire, although some representatives come from London, Harrow and Holloway Prison (not inmates, I hasten to say!)

Why am I telling you all this?

Until recently, the able Janice Richardson has been a conscientious Watford Committee member for the last 10 years or so and has decided to retire. On behalf of the WDP Watford Committee, I want to thank Janice for all her help, support, participation and diligence as your representative on this Committee. It would be lovely to have a representative from Christ Church or St Mark's to join me on the Watford WDP.
